

# Angelico Class Newsletter

## April 2018



Welcome back! I hope you all had a wonderful Easter break.

The timetable this term in Angelico is not too different to the previous terms. English and Numeracy will still predominantly feature in the morning sessions with Topic, PE, RE, French and Computing following in the afternoon.

Below you will find a brief review of this term's learning outline in Literacy, Numeracy and Science:

### *Literacy*

This term we will still be using the power of reading books. The book we will be looking at is *The Iron Man* by Ted Hughes. First published in 1968, *The Iron Man* has become a children's classic. The dramatic opening and memorable language instantly engage the reader. The book tells the story of a mysterious iron giant whose destructive quest for food alarms the local farming community. The story is told through the eyes of a young boy, Hogarth, who forms a friendship with the Iron Man.

### *Numeracy*

We commence this year focussing on fractions, ordering, comparing, adding and subtracting. Times tables will remain a focus throughout. We will be practicing these regularly with the aim to be able to recall these more fluently. This term we will also be looking at measurement and shape.

### *Science*

In science this term we will be focussing on Plants. We will be identifying and describing the functions of different parts of plants; roots, stem, leaves and flowers. Exploring the requirements of plants for life and growth (air, light, nutrients from soil and room to grow) and how they vary from plant to plant. Investigating the ways in which water is transported within plants.

### *Topic*

This term our topic will be 'Our Wonderful World'. This will form the basis for our work completed in history, geography, art and DT. Computing will be taught as a separate subject in line with the new curriculum.

### *RE*

Religious Education (RE) will be following the Kent Agreed Syllabus (KAS) which incorporates the new resource "Understanding Christianity". Each unit has a key question which is developed over a school term. Key questions are also being developed for other faiths that are part of the KAS.

In Terms 5 and 6 our key questions to explore are:

*Christianity: When Jesus left, what was the impact of Pentecost?*

*Sikhism: How do Sikh people worship and celebrate?*

*French, Music and PE*

French will be taught by myself on a Tuesday afternoon. Music will be taking place on a Friday afternoon. PE will take place on a Wednesday and Friday, so please could you make sure your child has the appropriate PE kit in school.

### **Home Learning**

Children will be set a piece of numeracy and literacy homework each week with the week's topic in that area in mind. This will be set on a Friday and is expected to be completed by the following Wednesday. Home learning is reviewed regularly to ensure understanding. I would encourage children to complete their homework on time and with appropriate effort and presentation. Unfortunately, if homework is not completed children would be required to attend homework club.

### *Reading*

Reading is an important part of a child's development and your support is truly valued. I ask that you spend 15 minutes each evening listening to your child read. Choosing books for children to read can often prove a difficult task so please do not hesitate to discuss this with me, I am more than happy help in this area. Children will have a reading book that links to Accelerated Reader at an appropriate book level. Your child will also be given a contact book. The main purpose for this book is for you to record their reading (name of book, author, pages read and any comments about their reading you think would be of help). It may also be used to write any information, comments or concerns you may want to raise.

### *Spelling*

Spellings will require children to practice and apply these both at home and at school.

### *Numeracy*

Times table and mental arithmetic tests will be completed weekly.
